CODE OF CONDUCT

Players

- Understand and observe the Rules of the Game.
- Always show respect and use appropriate language and behaviour towards other players, officials, or anyone else.
- Always display a positive attitude and show the right commitment to Hart F.C.
- Accept victory modestly and defeat graciously.
- Be a good team player, putting the interest of your team first.

Parents and Spectators

- Understand and obey the Rules of Association Football.
- Always use appropriate language and behaviour towards officials, players and other spectators.
- Always let your Club or Team Representative deal with any problems that may arise.
- Recognise good sporting behaviour – show that you appreciate sportsmanship on and off the field.
- Remember – Youth football is a game of enjoyment for boys and girls. The players need your praise and encouragement.

Managers, Coaches and Helpers

- Consider the individual needs of each child in your care, by encouraging and respecting sporting achievement.
- Ensure transport is safe and secure, with the appropriate insurance cover and parental consent.
- Avoid situations or conduct that could offend, or be misinterpreted in any way.
- Always display the correct and appropriate behaviour to others.
- Ensure that each player is dressed correctly with necessary equipment, shin pads etc., before being allowed to play or train.
- Record the numbers and names of the children in your charge, at every match, training session or event.
- Undertake to attend courses arranged by your Club or League, to improve skills in First Aid, Football Coaching and Leadership.
- Undertake to actively ensure compliance to this Code of Conduct, by drawing attention to your Club of any non-compliance.
- Hart F.C. aim to work towards developing children's self discipline and self-esteem in an atmosphere of mutual respect and encouragement, and to make football safe and enjoyable.
